Bayanihan Concludes Tour in Australia Following Celebrations for 2016 Philippine Independence Day and 70th Anniversary of Philippines-Australia Relations

Following their performance at the National Gallery of Australia for the Philippine Independence Day reception hosted by the Philippine Embassy in Canberra, Bayanihan once again amazed the guests of the Independence Day Celebration Ball hosted by Filipino Community Council of ACT (FCCACT) on 18 June 2016.
